# Summary of October 15, 2009 Annual Meeting

The homeowners approved the proposed budget for 2010 of \$21,250. Annual dues remain at \$125.

The homeowners approved raising the penalty for late payment of annual dues to \$50 or the limit set by usury law, whichever is less.

The homeowners overwhelmingly approved the proposed policy regarding trees in the common areas. The new rule was published in the October newsletter.

The homeowners overwhelmingly approved the proposed policy regarding fences. The new rule was published in the October newsletter. Given the lively discussion on the new policy for fences on corner lots, the Board of Directors has consulting our attorney to make certain that the approved policy conforms to the Restrictive Covenants.

Concern was expressed that the Restrictive Covenants and Rules and Regulations regarding the appearance of property are not being vigorously enforced. The Board and ACC have notified homeowners through recent newsletters that they are pursuing such violations (see also article below).

Board of Directors members John Kitzmiller, Keith Ferguson, Dante Gilmer, Jaime Gutierrez and Kirk Randall were reelected for another term. Lee Sottile nominated herself for Board membership, was elected by the homeowners, and resigned a few days later.

#### President's Letter

The HFCA Board is reminding homeowners about requirements to maintain their properties in the Restrictive Covenants and Rules and Regulations. The Restrictive Covenants were in place when homeowners purchased their property and were required to have been so notified by the seller under the Virginia Property Owners Association Act. The purpose of these articles is to keep our community a desirable place to live.

Common violations are allowing tree branches and bushes to extend over sidewalks to the point that they are restricting passage. Please prune your trees and bushes near sidewalks. Keeping the sidewalk clear is also a requirement of Fairfax County.

Also, trailers are being parked in front of houses well beyond the seven day limit specified in

the Restrictive Covenants. Please move these trailers immediately.

Many fences are in disrepair and need maintenance.

Finally, it is against our Rules and Regulations to store trash containers in front of the house.

This is the last notice via newsletter before individual letters are mailed to homeowners. Thank you for your help in keeping our neighborhood a great place to live.

## This Month's Home Maintenance Checklist

**Dehumidifier Shutdown** – Clean out the dehumidifier bucket and vacuum the coils when you shut it down for the season.

**Smoke Alarms & Carbon Monoxide Detectors Check** – Replace smoke detector batteries (don't wait for them to die). Press test buttons on smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors. Open each unit and vacuum dust that could interfere with operation. Carbon monoxide detector batteries are usually not replaceable by the user.

**Water Heater Flushing** – Drain the hot water heater to remove sediment that makes the heater run inefficiently. Turn the gas valve to the "pilot" setting. Shut off the cold water supply valve. Connect a hose from the water heater drain valve to the nearby floor drain or outdoors. Open a nearby sink hot water faucet to prevent a vacuum. Open the water heater drain valve. When the water starts running cold, close the heater drain valve and remove the hose. Open the cold water supply valve. When water flows freely from the open sink faucet, turn off the faucet. Turn the gas control to the "On" setting.

Furnace & Heat Pump Fall Checkup – Schedule a fall service checkup or do it yourself.

### City of Fairfax Water Survey

Many Hickory Farms residents get sewer service from Fairfax County and water service from the City of Fairfax. A few get both services from Fairfax County. If you only get one sewer/water bill, then this message is *not* for you.

According to a recent survey, we are paying almost twice the price for Fairfax City water when compared with Fairfax County's water utility. <u>www.fcwa.org/rates/rate%20comparison%202009.pdf</u> This could be costing each homeowner as much as \$150 extra per year. The Board of Supervisors has only just recently become aware of this issue and has asked County staff to investigate. Part of the investigation is an online customer survey being conducted by County staff through November 15 at <u>www.fairfaxcounty.gov/news/2009/consumer-protection-seeks-input-water.htm</u> Please participate in the survey. If you are concerned about the City of Fairfax possibly overcharging Fairfax County water customers, you may also want to contact Supervisor John Cook's assistant who is working on this issue, Rosemary Ryan, at 703-425-4048 or Rosemary.Ryan@fairfaxcounty.gov and give her your thoughts.

#### If You Plan To Sell Your Home, Please Read

When you sell your home, you will need to give the purchaser a copy of the Hickory Farms Virginia Property Owners' Association Act (VPOAA) Disclosure Package. This is required by law. If you do not provide a copy of this document to the purchaser, the purchaser could delay closing or cancel the sale.

The Hickory Farms Disclosure Package was revised in 2009 to reflect changes in the law. Hickory Farms distributes the Disclosure Package in two parts, and both parts must be given to the new homeowner at time of closing (at the latest).

Part 1 contains specific information on your property. In your request, you or your agent may specify a letter or email containing Part 1 information. Please contact the Hickory Farms Treasurer by telephone or email to arrange delivery. Please allow at least three weeks prior to closing to give our part time/volunteer Board member time to respond. There is no charge for Part 1 of the Disclosure Package. Please do not request Part 1 too early, though. If it takes a long time to sell your house, the information could become stale. We suggest you request the information when you have a signed contract to sell your house.

Please note that before Part 1 of the Disclosure package is released, your property will be inspected by a member of the Board of Directors or Architectural Control Committee to determine compliance with the Hickory Farms Rules & Regulations and Restrictive Covenants. If your property is not in compliance, the release of Part 1 may be delayed, thereby jeopardizing the sale of your property.

Part 2 contains information applicable to all homes in Hickory Farms. This 36-page document is available for free download at www.hickoryfarms.org. However, if you want a printed copy, please send a \$10 check, payable to HFCA, to P.O. Box 2239, Fairfax, VA 22031-2239 or the Treasurer's home (this is guickest, as the post office box is checked at most once a week). Please allow ten days business days from receipt of the check by the Treasurer to the date the Disclosure Package can be released, as we must allow time for your check to clear.

### Disposing of Your Leaves

#### Please Don't Rake Your Leaves Into the Street !

Fall is leaf raking time. If we lived just a few blocks north in Fairfax City, we could just rake our leaves into the street and city workers would vacuum them up. But, alas, we live in Fairfax County, so *please don't rake your leaves into the street !* Here's the skinny on disposing of your leaves (and other yard debris) in our community.

- Under Fairfax County ordinance, the trash collector, at its option, is required to pick up at least six bags of leaves on a yard debris pickup day. If you put out more than six, however, the extras may not be taken.
- If the trash collector doesn't take all of your leaves on your yard debris pickup day, please don't just leave them in the street or the parkway (that strip of grass between the street and sidewalk) for the next week's pickup. The bags kill the grass if left on the parkway, or block the mailman if left near the mailbox.
- Under Fairfax County Ordinance, you should not use black plastic bags for yard debris such as leaves. You are supposed to use clear plastic bags. The trash collector may refuse to take black bags because its workers can't tell whether you put garbage or yard debris such as leaves in the bags.

## Fairfax County May Limit Commercial Truck Parking on Residential Streets

The Board of Supervisors is considering banning commercial vehicles from parking in all residential neighborhoods. This action follows previous meetings over the past year about problems with large vehicles parking in neighborhoods. The proposed code changes are intended to better define commercial vehicles in the County Code, in order to improve parking enforcement and respond to complaints about large/commercial vehicles parking on residential streets. The changes are summarized below.

- Changes code requirement for taxicabs and limousines: One resident of each single family dwelling unit may park one vehicle licensed and registered in the Commonwealth of Virginia as a taxicab or limousine
- Expands definition of commercial vehicle restricted from parking in a residential area to include:
  - Any vehicle licensed as a common or contract carrier or limousine (except as above)
  - Vehicles that exceed size and weight limits: more than 21 feet long, more than 8 feet high including appurtenances, width of 102 inches or more, or gross vehicle weight of 12,000 or more pounds. Vehicles exempted from these size and weight limits are: commercial vehicles used by public service company, watercraft or motor home, school buses, vehicles driven by or used for transporting persons with disabilities, vehicles for cable television service, moving vehicles for 48 hours, vehicles for propane gas service. These "excepted" vehicles can park in a residential area unless restricted elsewhere in the Code, e.g., boats and motor homes are not allowed to park in areas that are Community Parking Districts
  - Vehicle carrying commercial freight in plain view
  - Trailer or semitrailer except camper, boat or single axle utility
  - Any vehicle with 3 or more axles
